Prof Dr Thitinan Pongsudhirak is a Professor of Political Science and International Relations at Chulalongkorn University, and a Senior Fellow at the university's Institute of Security and International Studies.

He has authored a host of articles, books, and book chapters on Thai politics, political economy, foreign policy, and media. He is also knowledgeable on ASEAN and East Asian security and economic cooperation.

Thitinan has held visiting positions at Victoria University in New Zealand, the Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS), Stanford University, Yangon University in Myanmar, and the ISEAS Yusof-Ishak Institute.

He received his BA from the University of California at Santa Barbara, MA from the Johns Hopkins SAIS, and PhD from the London School of Economics, where his thesis on the political economy of the 1997 Thai economic crisis was awarded the United Kingdom's Lord Bryce Prize for Best Dissertation in Comparative and International Politics.
